

Message from Jenna

It is hard to believe that Twist Out Cancer has been laying roots and blossoming for over fourteen years! When I founded Twist, I was in the midst of treatment for a rare blood cancer called Gray Zone Lymphoma. During that time, I made a promise to myself: if I survived, I would build the supportive, creative community I longed for—one where storytelling and the arts could help people heal, connect, and feel less alone.

Thanks to our extraordinary team, dedicated board members, and deeply generous supporters, that vision has grown beyond anything I could have imagined. Over the past decade, Twist Out Cancer’s reach and impact have continued to expand, touching thousands of individuals and families navigating cancer.

The past few years have been a period of significant growth. We built meaningful partnerships with leading cancer centers, including MD Anderson at Cooper and Rush University Health, City of Hope, Northern Westchester Hospital, and Little Company of Mary Hospital. We relaunched licensed programs with Blueprint Medicines and the Adrienne Arsht Performing Arts Center, enabling our model to reach new communities. Our Open Brushes with Cancer exhibitions expanded in Chicago and Philadelphia, creating space for even more stories to be seen and shared.

As we step into 2026, I feel both gratitude and excitement. Gratitude for the unwavering support, belief, and compassion of this community—and excitement for what lies ahead as we continue to dream bigger, reach farther, and deepen our impact.

Diversity and Inclusion

Mission

Twist Out Cancer recognizes the isolating feelings that can accompany any cancer experience. We strive to build a community inclusive of people of all races, ethnicities, gender identities, sexual orientations, ages, national origins, marital statuses, citizenships, abilities, veteran statuses, health statuses, socioeconomic statuses, and healthcare access. Twist Out Cancer believes in the power of using our personal backgrounds as a foundation for understanding the diversity of the cancer experience, sharing that experience with the world, and ultimately taking steps toward healing.

Cancer is one disease, but it is not one experience. We fully acknowledge that survivors of diverse identities often face additional layers of discrimination and trauma during their cancer journey, which makes healing even more complex. Twist Out Cancer attends to the emotional needs of anyone touched by cancer, no matter their cancer identity or personal identity.

At Twist, we know the power of the arts is an underutilized mechanism for healing. Institutional resources to address social and emotional wellness for anyone touched by cancer can be inequitable, bound by geography, and are often cost-prohibitive.

We believe that anyone touched by cancer should have the opportunity to experience art's transformative power to heal, which is why we are deeply committed to ensuring our programs remain accessible and free for all participants. By giving a platform to diverse voices through art, Twist also aims to promote healing on a societal level, one story at a time.

How we commit to inclusion in our community:

- Soliciting feedback from our participants, board members, staff, and community members, specifically about the unique challenges they face due to their intersectional social identities and how we can support them
- Partnering with organizations and healthcare systems that serve a diverse population of individuals touched by cancer, who otherwise may lack access to arts-based programming
- Carefully choosing modes of communication and language to reflect our mission to build an inclusive community
- Critically reflecting upon accessibility to our programs and acting to lower barriers that perpetuate inequality
- Utilizing licensed clinical staff in critical program areas who are trained to support diverse individuals' needs, and volunteer mentors in other areas to make sure all participants feel supported
- Pairing artists and inspirations together whose social identities would have likely never intersected outside the Twist space, to create unexpected and powerful friendships that bridge differences and build community
- Continuously assess our efforts to achieve equity and inclusion through our programming and implement necessary changes to improve those efforts

Twist Out Cancer is just getting started

What we do:

Twist Out Cancer provides psychosocial support to individuals touched by cancer through creative arts programming.

How we do it:

Twist Out Cancer's core program, **Brushes with Cancer**, improves the quality of life for survivors, previvors, caregivers and loved ones through a unique art experience.

Twist Out Cancer programs utilize the arts as a mechanism for healing. All programs allow participants to share their cancer experience and be heard. Through these unique expressions and connections, a vital support community grows.

The Impact of Twist Out Cancer Programming

To date, Twist Out Cancer has reached **288,036** people through our programming and outreach, including **Brushes with Cancer**, **Twistshops**, **Twist Hearts**, and more. This includes **1,704** people who participated in our **Brushes with Cancer** program as an Inspiration or Artist. As a result, there are now 853 unique pieces of art worldwide representing 853 individual journeys with cancer.

Increased Impact in 2025

In 2025, Twist Out Cancer experienced increased impact across program offerings compared to 2024, expanding access to creative support while maintaining the depth, care, and intentionality that define our mission.


Brushes with Cancer

- Program participation **expanded from 13 states to 26 states**, while continuing to maintain international reach
- Licensed program participation **increased by 4%**, reflecting sustained demand and deepening partner relationships

Twistshops

- Twistshop participation instances **increased by 180%**, signaling significant growth in demand for accessible, art-based emotional support
- Public Twistshop offerings **increased by 51%**, expanding opportunities for individuals to engage in creative reflection and connection



Brushes with Cancer

Brushes with Cancer is a transformative program that thoughtfully matches artists with individuals touched by cancer, known as “Inspirations.” Throughout the program, these pairs forge deep, meaningful connections rooted in mutual understanding and trust. The artist then creates a one-of-a-kind piece that reflects the Inspiration’s unique cancer journey. The program culminates in a celebratory event that honors survivorship and hope, where the artwork is auctioned off, with all proceeds supporting the mission and work of Twist Out Cancer.

In 2025, Brushes with Cancer brought together **130 participants** across four impactful programs, resulting in **66 powerful works of art** that captured stories of inspiration, resilience, and healing. These participants hailed from twenty-six states and three countries, expanding the program’s reach and amplifying its mission to share, connect, and heal within and beyond the borders of the United States.


Brushes with Cancer Public Programs

By the Numbers:

- 80 participants
- 40 works of art inspired by a cancer experience
- 2 art exhibitions and celebratory events
- 1 extended artwork installation
- 10,860 people touched by the artwork

In 2025, Twist Out Cancer proudly hosted two Brushes with Cancer public programs, drawing participants from diverse backgrounds and serving 80 individuals. The sold-out celebratory events, held at Writer’s Theatre in Chicago and Lilah Fishtown in Philadelphia, each provided a unique and profoundly impactful experience for participants, their loved ones, and the larger Twist Out Cancer community. Across these two programs, 41 extraordinary works of art were showcased, each serving as a powerful expression of a deeply personal journey. The 2025 Brushes with Cancer public programs and celebratory events highlighted the incredible artwork and celebrated the meaningful connections nurtured between Inspirations, Artists, and the broader Twist Out Cancer community.

The powerful artwork featured in the Philadelphia exhibition was extended at the Old City Jewish Arts Center in Pennsylvania, allowing these works of art to continue telling the stories of those whose lives have been touched by cancer.

Brushes with Cancer Licensed Programs

By the Numbers:

- 50 participants
- 25 works of art inspired by a cancer experience
- 3 art exhibitions and celebratory events
- 10,826 people touched by the artwork

2025 marked an affirming year for Brushes with Cancer Licensed Programs, reflecting both programmatic growth and the strength of sustained partnerships. For the second consecutive year, Twist Out Cancer licensed Brushes with Cancer to Blueprint Medicines and the Adrienne Arsht Center for the Performing Arts, deepening relationships grounded in trust, shared values, and a commitment to creative healing.


Through these partnerships, Brushes with Cancer reached beyond our immediate community to engage individuals across a broader healthcare ecosystem, including oncology professionals within the systemic mastocytosis field through our licensed program with Blueprint Medicines. By equipping partner organizations to integrate creative arts into their communities, Twist Out Cancer expanded access to reflection, connection, and meaning-making. Collectively, these programs provided 50 additional participants with a powerful storytelling platform—transforming experiences often shaped by fear or isolation into ones rooted in recognition, connection, and hope.


positivity — qualities that shaped how he navigated his cancer journey and how he showed up for those around him.

As an Inspiration, she not only participates with openness and intention, but consistently encourages those around her — family, friends, and fellow participants — to engage, volunteer, and experience the power of creative connection for themselves. Her presence reflects a quiet leadership rooted in generosity, acceptance, and resilience, creating space for others to feel welcomed, supported, and seen.

Through this award, Twist Out Cancer celebrates not only Shawn's legacy, but the individuals who carry that spirit forward and strengthen the community by inviting others to share, connect, and heal together.

The Jacqueline Carmody Creative Artist Award is presented annually to a Brushes with Cancer artist participating in the program who exemplifies trust, openness, connection,

and a vibrant creative spirit. The award honors artists who approach creative partnership with care and intention, using art as a means of listening, honoring lived experience, and fostering resilience through shared storytelling.

In 2025, Twist Out Cancer is proud to recognize Matt Eckerle as the recipient of the Jacqueline Carmody Creative Artist Award.

Matt embodies the spirit of this award through his deep engagement with the Twist Out Cancer mission and his genuine enthusiasm for the Brushes with Cancer process. In 2025, he participated in two Brushes with Cancer programs, bringing thoughtfulness, care, and continuity to each experience. Notably, Matt carried the story of his match—and her family—with profound respect after she passed during the program, honoring her life and legacy through his continued creative presence.

He approaches each partnership with curiosity, humility, and a willingness to move beyond what is comfortable or expected. Matt embraced the program not only as an artist, but as a collaborator deeply invested in connection, meaning-making, and shared experience. Through his thoughtful presence, creative leadership, and visible passion for the work, Matt demonstrates how art can serve as a powerful vehicle for resilience and healing. His commitment to the Brushes with Cancer process reflects the heart of this award and the values it was created to honor.

Fostering Resilience in 2025

Brushes with Cancer is designed to support individuals impacted by cancer through creative expression, reflection, and connection. By inviting participants to share their stories, be witnessed, and create meaning through art, the program fosters resilience not as endurance alone, but as growth, vulnerability, and shared humanity.

When asked what resilience means to them and whether participating in Brushes with Cancer fostered resilience in coping with their cancer experience, participants described resilience in deeply personal and varied ways, emphasizing the role of creativity and connection in navigating the cancer journey.





Twistshops

By the Numbers:

- 804 Twistshop participants
- 47 Public Twistshops
- 12 Private Twistshops
- 17 Community or Partner Organization Twistshops
- Countless art-making experiences

Twistshops are art therapy-focused workshops designed to foster healing, relaxation, and emotional recovery through creative expression. Using art therapy-based interventions, these workshops aim to alleviate symptoms of depression, anxiety, and stress commonly associated with cancer. Led by a licensed art therapist, participants engage in a variety of art-making activities that offer a space to process their experiences, as patients, survivors, caregivers, or previvors. Through the combined power of storytelling and mindful art-making, the workshops encourage participants to explore their emotions, creating opportunities for healing in the community.

Monthly Free Virtual Twistshop Series

In 2025, the Monthly Virtual Twistshop Series engaged 164 participation instances through a yearlong sequence of creative sessions. Participants explored themes of rest and restoration, curiosity and playfulness, seasonal reflection, and personal meaning-making—including sessions centered on Winter Solstice reflection and spring energy. These experiences were facilitated through trauma-informed creative practices, including Matisse-style collage, narrative therapy prompts, neurographic art, Zentangles, nature symbolism, and one-word reflections, inviting participants to explore what brings them gladness, grounding, and renewal.

Cancer Identity Representation* (for open to the public sessions)

- Survivors: ~ 70%
- Caregivers: ~ 25%
- Healthcare Professionals: ~ 5%

*Cancer identity data reflects voluntary, self-reported responses only. Not all participants chose to share this information, and some selected more than one identity. No assumptions were made for responses not provided.

Private Twistshop Partnerships

In 2025, Twist Out Cancer's Private Twistshops supported **273 participation instances** across healthcare and corporate partners through trauma-informed, art-based experiences designed to foster emotional expression, connection, and well-being for individuals impacted by cancer. Delivered through ongoing partnerships with Northern Westchester Hospital, RUSH RAB, RUSH Lisle, MD Anderson Cooper, and Little Company of Mary, these programs reflect sustained demand for creative spaces that support reflection, resilience, and care.

Across sites, participants engaged in intentional art-making sessions exploring themes such as rest and restoration, grief

and acceptance, joy and curiosity, survivorship, emotional needs, and reconnection with nature. Experiences incorporated a range of accessible creative practices, including soothing color work, Zentangles, blackout poetry, symbolic collage, sensory memory exercises, and nature-based processes, offering participants opportunities for meaning-making, grounding, and shared understanding.

Through these private Twistshops, partner organizations continued to integrate creative expression as a supportive resource within their communities, extending Twist Out Cancer's mission beyond public programs and reinforcing the value of long-term, trust-based collaboration.

Team Twist

Team Twist Out Cancer was launched in 2023 to bring together individuals in our community who are passionate about raising awareness and critical funds for Twist Out Cancer programs through fitness and athletic activities. Operating in a “choose your own adventure” format, Team Twist allows participants to train for events that inspire them or hold personal significance. Team Twist events include, but are not limited to, 5ks, 10ks, marathons, triathlons, Spartan Races, cycling races, yoga, dance, and CrossFit competitions.

Since its inception, Team Twist has raised over \$14,000 to support the mission of Twist Out Cancer, and we’re excited to expand participation and engagement across our global community in 2026 to continue driving the mission forward.

The new Team Twist year begins in May 2026, and we invite our community and beyond to lace up, show up, and **launch their own Team Twist!**


Voices, Stories, and Reflection

Originally launched in 2022, Twist Out Cancer’s podcast, “Stories of Hope and Inspiration,” contributes to our focus on intentional storytelling and sustained digital engagement.

In 2025, **9** episodes were released, adding to a library of **54** total episodes and reaching **1,200+** downloads, supporting deeper engagement with participants and the broader Twist Out Cancer community.



Twist Out Cancer Blog


